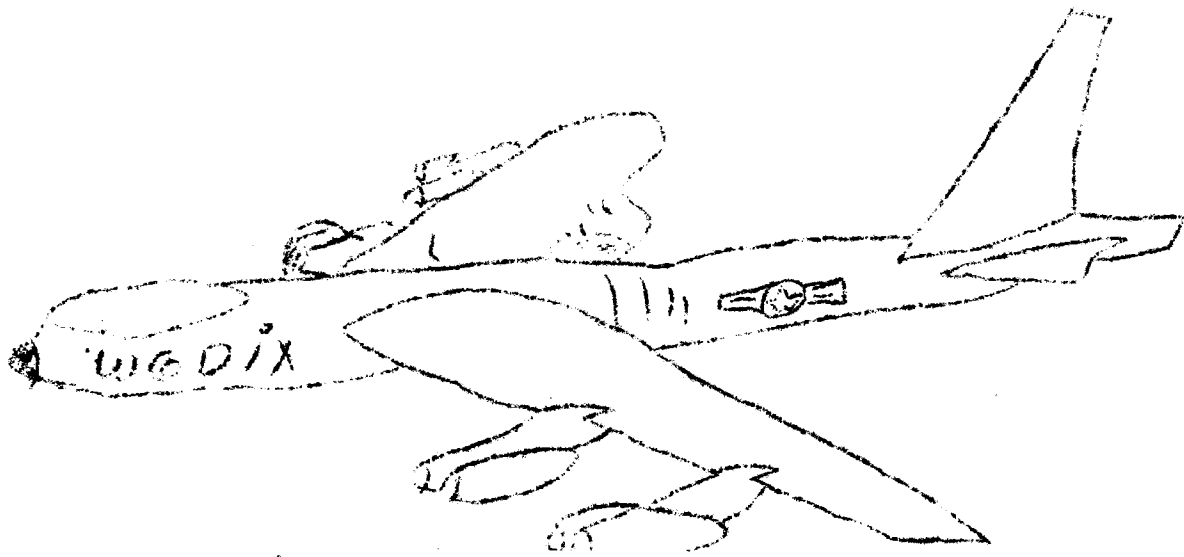

Floyd closes his letter with: "If you or any of the boys ever come over this way and can stop by, remember the McCoys' is your home away from home."

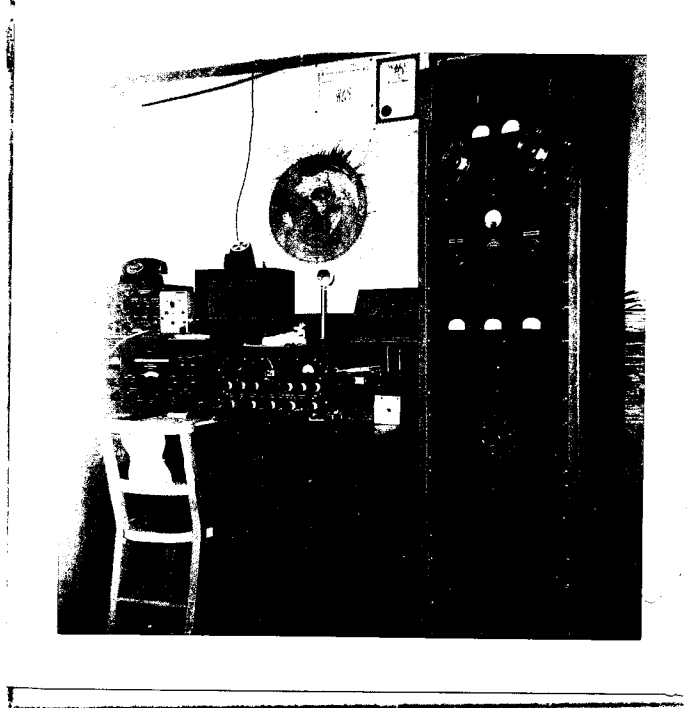

Pictured above is the layout of our newest member, K. D. Wilson, W6DIX, 21 Los Aldronas, Novato, Calif. DIX goes by the name "KD".

KD says he was bit by the ham bug back in 1924 when he happened to hear some faint sigs from across the ocean on an old 2 tube (201As) receiver set up at an electric exhibit. The bite took, because the same year he was owner and op of OH6BVW. The first rig was a pair of 211s, back to back, and KD was a traffic man, making the "Brass Pounders" nearly every month. Upon returning to the States (KD has been in the Army Air Corps, now USAF, for 34 years) was assigned W3GT at Washington, DC. From this QTH he was the Eastern end of the old KALHR-W6AD-W9COS-W3GT circuit on 40 meters. While at DC, he also had a hand in the Byrd S. Pole expedition, Wilkins N. Pole flight, and the Southern Cross flight to VK land.

KD has had some interesting experiences during his 34 years in the service. He says, "in 1928, the Air Corps (old name) decided to try frequencies above 2000 kcs

from plane to ground. Using equipment borrowed from PAA, we installed a 210 MOPA plus a pretty little TRF receiver in a tri-motor Ford and under the call AB6, 5550 Kc. toured the cold regions of USA and Canada. It got down to 47 below but we kept skeds with old 2XE (G.E.), WLAW and other hams, while flying. Within 30 days we went from cold to hot; South America and the jungle. On the way back we lost the airplane in the Mexican Jungle but I got out ok as can be seen."

About this time KD was getting weary of extremes in weather, and having the choice between Panama and California, the XYL decided on Calif. (remember, this was BEFORE the winter of 1955-56 - ed) In 1931, at Riverside, he received W6DIX. In 1934, DIX QSY'd to Hamilton Field where he has stayed ever since, except for some tramping about during the late fracas. It was here that he was introduced to 20 meters and DX. The first transmitter was a 35T and a PRL6 receiver. KD says this equipment was later lost to the Indian Ocean, courtesy the Japs. He says his pre-war score was only about 12 countries.

After the war, KD started out in earnest after the DX. WAC 10-20-40. Also WAS 10-20-40 and WACC in 93 days. (Try working all Calif. Counties sometime and you will find it rougher than DXCC - ed). DIX is probably the only member of the club who has a WACC. Also has worked all numbered districts in England, Australia, New Zealand, Argentina, VP1-9, Chile, Japan, PK 1-7, and all American possessions except KC4. The post war score is 133 worked and 127 confirmed and 35 zones.

About a year or so ago a couple of jokers led KD astray and now he spends about 50% of his time on SSSB.

Referring to the photo above: 20ASSB VFO exciter, 75A2 and Viking 1. The big rack on the right contains two linear amps, one a single 304TL and the other a pair of 810s in PP. Both are built around Jennings Variable vacuums. KD is currently in the process of building his "final final" which will be a PI net with variable vacuums and ending up with either a 304 or 4-1000.

The antennas are all home built jobs and are: (guess I should say were, because the big storm of last December leveled the whole works - ed) 3 el. 20 mtr. beam, 2 el. 15, and half wave doublets for 40 and 80. KD isn't strictly from DX, and finds time for such things as being NCS for MARS on Thursdays (3295), CD on Mondays (1995) and is Socy/Treas of Mt. Tamalpais Radio Club. He keeps busy mainly as a result of being NCOIC of Hamilton Field Base Communications Maintenance.

KD says his main activities at present are looking for a SM4 and VE1 for a couple of new certificates, and enjoying two granddaughters. If you are ever in the vicinity of Novato, drop in and see KD. He likes visitors.

Official Bul. No. 524 from ARRL -- 15 Dec. '55

Recently discovered means of long distance propagation of VHF waves indicate that reliable communication over distances up to 1300 miles or more should be possible in the amateur 50 mc band. Requirements for this work are high power, large antennas, low noise receivers and CW. The medium, scattering in the E region of the ionosphere, provides weak but consistent signals, suitable for the maintenance of schedules but difficult to observe by other means. ----

Official Bul. No. 526 from ARRL - 29 Dec. '55

The FCC public notice of June 1, 1953 and as since revised, in compliance with U.S. Treaty obligations, cautions U S Amateurs not to communicate with stations in Cambodia, Indonesia, Iran, Korea and Viet Nam. Prefixes to be avoided are 3W8, PK, EQ, HL, and F18.
