Via NCDXC 144 mcs. intercom from Pittsburgh, Calif.

K6AHV reports that he lost practically all of his amateur gear when a ground bus lifted temporarily in a transformer feeding his house and applied 220 volts to everything in the house that was on at the time. He was operating at the time and lost receiver, exciter and final. All lights in the house were blown. His keyer did not go and beam rotator (which was not on) were about the only items not lost. He has the receiver back but is limping along on a borrowed exciter (courtesy W6LDD). Bob worked the contest from Dale Hoppe's location at Fallbrook in Southern California. His score is presented elsewhere in this issue. Despite being off the air for approximately 8 hours he did extremely well and has a lot to report concerning the activity. He hopes to make our 12 November meeting to elaborate on his adventures. His score will not count for either club, but will probably be submitted as a single entry. Antennas used were 5 elements on 40 at 101 feet, 5 elements on 20 at 100 feet and stacked 5's on 15 meters. A reversible Rhombic was used on 80 & 160 and two wire beams were also available on 80 meters. For ten meters a triband beam was used. Bob mentioned that Gordon Marshall W6ITA ran up a score of approximately 400,000 pts. for the S. Cal. Club. Many members worked from XE2BC where they ran up a point score of some 2,100,000. ZD2AR had approx. 2.7 million and YV9AA was also a high scorer having over the million mark.

A letter from Ellen White of ARRL to Rich states:

" The NCDXC might find it helpful to review the procedures used in cases of log discrepancies. If, for example, we cannot verify a certain percentage of either contacts or multipliers (by the DX logs, the log extracts, or information from the society concerned) entries become subject to review by the Awards Committee and subject to their decision on disqualification.

In the heat of a contest we realize calls get confused and we look at a few such errors reasonably. However, when a goodly percentage of contacts claimed cannot be proven, the log itself is subject to doubt. Other high scoring claims get this same scrutiny and we know it is possible to be a top scorer and at the same time have the DX station record all aspects of the exchange correctly."

AZORES - CT2AH

Will resume SSB activity in the near future per FEDXP. No details as yet.

Yemen - 4W1K

Operates frequently on 14080, 21075, and 28050 kc CW (DXMB DXNS) Doug, K6TZX reports having made the grade recently on 21075 CW.

FERNANDO DE NORONHA - PY7ACQ/Ø

This DXpedition, scheduled to start around 22 October for one week, has been postponed but may be active now. CW frequencies will be on the low end of all bands and SSB on 3610, 7059, 14110, and 21241 kc. QSL Radio Club of Recife, Box 842 Recife, Brazil.

Glorioso - FR7ZI/G

LIDXA quotes W6RKP, "Look for FR7ZI/G around 7 November" (JanJac often is heard on 14082 CW)

Vatican City - HV1CN

Operation scheduled during the CQ WW DX Contest (CW), Nov 27-28 (and likely before that) by W9AC, W8DUS, and W9IOP. Frequencies will be 3506, 7006, 14060, and 21060 kc. QSL to W9IOP.

Crozet - FB8WW

Maurice - active on 14 and 21 mc CW and AM. 21051 CW at 13-1400Z and AM at 0330z on 14143 kc (Trx LIDXA) - W6WB reports hearing Maurice on 14125 Oct 28 0330z.

Following corrections on guests at Sept. meeting; K7CTI and WA6HAE were accidentally omitted; the minutes were accepted and a treasury report made.

First readings were made on the following applications; W6BVB, K6CCY, K6DXM, and W6BIP. Second readings were made on WA6VAT, WA6DJI and W6CUF. All were voted into membership.

W6ERS and W6BYS spoke on the ARRL's scoring in the 1965 DX contest. Bob Thompson related what he knew of contest disqualifications. He also mentioned that the joint NCDX/SCDXC meeting will be held at Del Webb's Town House, 2220 Tulare Ave., Fresno, Calif. Tel.nr. is 209-268-8211.

Comment was made that the SCDXC was disturbed over the 1965 NCDXC win. W6ERS made a motion to appoint a committee to contact Ellen White and get a statement of facts regarding the disqualifications of Don Miller & Ron Camp. K6OHJ then made a motion to table the aforementioned motion. This was seconded and went to vote. Passed by a majority vote.

K6OHJ asked the secretary to write Joe Horvath a letter to arrange for a charter bus, Saturday & Sunday, Jan. 22 & 23, 1966 for the trip to Fresno.

It was also asked that the Sec. write to Carl Brachman WA6EPQ regarding the retirement of the present DX Trophy. There is room for only one more name, the "Tie Breaker" on it.

Jim Neiger spoke on the coming CQ contest and urged that all members participate.

After the round-table the meeting adjourned at 1137PM.
