A letter from Ellen White of ARRL to Rich states:

"The NCDXC might find it helpful to review the procedures used in cases of log discrepancies. If, for example, we cannot verify a certain percentage of either contacts or multipliers (by the DX logs, the log extracts, or information from the society concerned) entries become subject to review by the Awards Committee and subject to their decision on disqualification.

In the heat of a contest we realize calls get confused and we look at a few such errors reasonably. However, when a goodly percentage of contacts claimed cannot be proven, the log itself is subject to doubt. Other high scoring claims get this same scrutiny and we know it is possible to be a top scorer and at the same time have the DX station record all aspects of the exchange correctly."
