This meeting was presided over by President Jack Brollier, K6ERV, and was held at Taddy's in San Mateo. Although again on a Thursday just prior to the second half of the ARRL Fone DX Contest, there were 46 members and guests present. Guests were: W6NTJ, W6LFS, WA6GQC, WA6IVN, W6ETR, W6OAG, WA6UFW, G3MHV (the first British ham granted U.S.A. reciprocal licensing privileges); and, special guest, to me, my wife, Claire.

The Treasurer's report was: Bank balance ----- \$402.02

Second reading for membership was given to W6FOJ. He was unanimously voted into membership. First reading was given to the application of W6OAG.

Reading of the minutes was dispensed with due to the press of time.

The subject of the impending visit of Gus Browning was discussed at some length. Both pros and cons were presented regarding Gus' request for fees and expenses. Despite the fact that the NCDXC Treasury cannot afford such expense, it was moved (by W6ERS) and voted that this club invite Gus Browning to appear and present his program. It was agreed by the majority that the members of this club would underwrite the cost on an individual basis, if necessary, in order to avail itself and members of the guest appearance of one of the great DX'ers of our time.

The balance of the evening was turned over to special guests (and club members), Lloyd Colvin, W6KG, and Iris Colvin, WB6QEP (new call!), recently of Ebon Atoll and other interesting Pacific area points. Their slides and narative gave ample justification for the influx of attendance at this meeting. Their future travel and hamming plans call for the British Isle area, first, (GC, ZB), then on to Africa and more rare calls.

There was no roundtable discussion, and the meeting was adjourned at 11:30.
