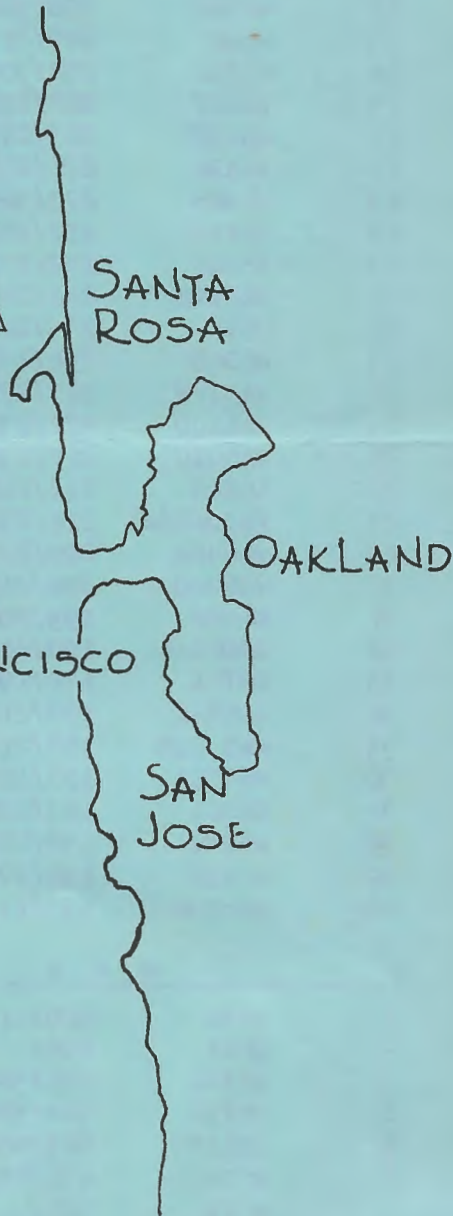

NOVEMBER 1968 MEETING OF THE NCDXC

The November 8, 1968 meeting of the Northern California DX Club was called to order by President Vallio at the Blue Lion Restaurant in San Leandro at 9:00 PM. There were 63 members and guests present.

The chair announced that, in accordance with expressed club policy, the meeting was being held at a restaurant with a P. A. system, but the system was broken.

A letter from the Southern California DX Club to W6NJU of the CQ Awards Committee was read, the club taking the position that scores made by a club member away from his own area and in some exotic DX locality were not in the spirit of the competition. They suggested that some change be made.

The chair advised that because of the problems of recent meetings that any new business items should be taken up with the President or a Board Member prior to the meeting.

Guests of the members and XYLs were introduced.

The second reading was given the application of William Winnegar, W6CLM, and he was voted into membership.

The minutes of the October meeting were approved as distributed to the membership through the DX'er. The treasurer reported a balance of \$306.18 as of the end of October.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The Fresno DX meeting committee reported on the arrangements for the meeting and the facilities that would be available.

The California Award Committee reported that Award #128 had been issued to ZL1AGO, #129 to 9M2PO, #130 to UA2AC and #131 to DL1RK. The application of UWØIW is pending.

Joe Horvath, W6GPG, asked that a volunteer assistant be named to help him with the bus so that someone would be familiar with the arrangements for future years. WA6AHF volunteered.

The Contest Committee reported that there was good activity during the phone portion of the CQ contest but that more reports were needed whether single-operator or multi-operator. W6BH reported that the Central Team had WA6IVN as a multi-operator with an apparent score of one and a half million and several other stations had from a half-million to one million score.

The membership committee had no report.

K6KQN announced that the January meeting would be held in San Francisco's Chinatown.

Under New Business, WA6UFW moved and it was seconded that the motion tabled at the previous meeting which would have put guest speakers on the program before the business meeting be taken from the table. The motion to take from the table lost on a show of hands.

W6WX announced that CQ Magazine would have a write-up on the Northern California DX Club in the December issue.

WA6IVN announced that he had tapes of ZD9BL working club members which he would run at the end of the meeting.

On the ARRL Advisory Committees, it was suggested that the Club nominate members for these committees.

Nominations were made for the Contest Committee and on a show of hands W6WX was named. Nominations were made for the VHF Repeater Advisory Committee and WA6UFW was named.

The business meeting was adjourned to hear WA6AHF tell of his recent trip to San Andres Island and his operation as WA6AHF/HKØ and to see the slides of the operation.

After a round-table discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 12:00 midnight.

SHOULD THERE BE A PECKING ORDER?

"Great fleas have little fleas upon their backs to bite 'em,
And little fleas have lesser fleas, and so on, ad infinitum;
And the great fleas themselves, in turn, have greater fleas to go on,
While these again have greater still, and greater still, and so on."

---- De Morgan

It is well known that many biological species have developed among themselves a pecking order to provide some measure of stability within the community for the preservation of the species. Certain members of the group, by virtue of their physical prowess, aggressive tendencies, bluster, guile, and other patterns of behavior, have staked out territorial claims and acquired priority in feeding habits, etc., thus gaining preference over their less fortunate brethren.

The question naturally arises as to whether the hams of the present establishment might profit from this experience as well as fleas and thus array themselves in some kind of hierarchal order. Naturally, this would not remain an immutable arrangement. For example, if operator A possesses superior transmitting facilities and is fortuitously endowed with certain helpful attributes, not all of them respectabel, should he be expected constantly to take precedence in a DX shouting match over operator B, whose electronic installation and personal operating characteristics (voice, for one thing) are inferior to those of operator A? Indeed, in the present dog-eat-dog modus operandi, might not the flea-bitten operator exercise caution and restraint and not waste his breath calling at an inopportune time, thereby indulging in what has been described as an exercise in futility? All other things being equal, the oft-repeated remark that "nice guys never win" may apply here.

Be that as it may, it is suggested that the next time a membership list is prepared, it might be instructive and informative to add under the name of each member an additional line with properly abbreviated symbols denoting the following data: type amplifier, antenna system, boom length, antenna height, station elevation, and other relevant facts, if space permits. The operator's class of license could be thrown in for good measure. Armed with this information, an operator could decide, on the basis of his competition, whether or not it is worth opening his mouth to call, or if he possesses facilities comparable with those of another operator, to ascertain why, in heaven's name, the other fellow is always answered. Still other usages of the data may suggest themselves to the serious operator.

In Conclusion, is there any merit to the above proposal, or is it too unworthy of consideration?
