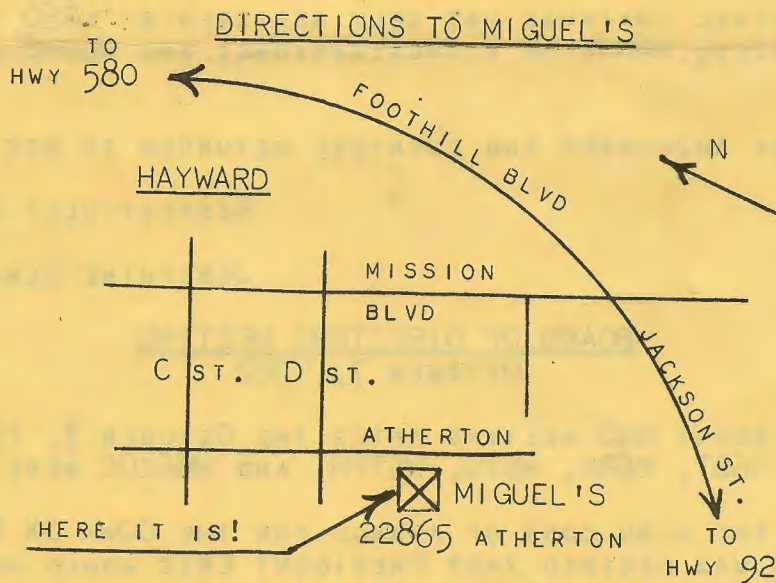

FLASH ! - 30 METERS OPEN

ON OCTOBER 28, 1982 AT 3:00 PM EDT THE FCC RELEASED A MAJOR PORTION OF THE 30 METER (10MHz) BAND FOR USE BY GENERAL, ADVANCED AND EXTRA CLASS AMATEUR LICENSEES. THE FREQUENCIES RELEASED ARE 10,100 - 10,109 KHZ AND 10,115 - 10,150 KHZ. AMATEUR OPERATION IS RESTRICTED TO CW AND RTTY ONLY WITH A MAXIMUM INPUT POWER OF 250 WATTS. AMATEURS MUST AVOID INTERFERING WITH FIXED SERVICE STATIONS IN THIS BAND WHO HAVE PRIMARY ALLOCATIONS. BE CAREFUL, BUT GET ON, THERE IS A LOT OF ACTION.

MINUTES OF NCDXC MEETING

OCTOBER 7, 1982

THE OCTOBER MEETING AT HARRY'S HOFBRAU IN PALO ALTO BEGAN AT 7:45 PM WITH THE FOLLOWING GUESTS INTRODUCED: N4DVW, W6ZO, N6DUQ, W6DSZ, OX5JW, N6CYS, WA6LKM, W6YFW AND W6RFF.

W6DU INTRODUCED VIC CLARK, W4KFC, PRESIDENT OF THE ARRL, WHO GAVE A SHORT TALK NOTING THAT THE DXERS IMAGE IS UNDER SCRUTINY AND PERHAPS WE NEED MORE SALESMANSHIP AND PARTICIPATION IN OTHER ACTIVITIES. HE NOTES THAT THE COLVINS HAVE BEEN GOOD AMBASSADORS WHEREVER THEY TRAVEL. HE IS TRYING TO GET OVERSEAS AMATEURS TO HELP TO GET RADIO AMATEUR STAMPS ISSUED.

N3AKD, CHRIS IMLAY, COUNSEL FOR THE ARRL, WENT ON TO ANSWER GENERAL QUESTIONS. DAVE, N6AUS, ASKED WHEN A LAW REQUIRING ALL AMATEURS TO HAVE A TOWER 200 FEET HIGH WOULD BE PASSED! CHRIS SAID THAT THE NEW LAW SAYS THAT MUNICIPALITIES WILL NOT BE ABLE TO INTERFERE IN ANTENNA JURISDICTION EXCEPT FOR SAFETY REASONS. HE SAID THAT THE NEW WARC AGREEMENT RADIFICATION IS IMMINENT. BILL, W6ZM, SAID THAT THE NEW 10 MHZ BAND WILL NOT BE USED FOR CONTESTS OR DXCC CREDIT. CHRIS STATED THAT THE NEW RFI LAW FOR MANUFACTURERS IS NOT RETROACTIVE.

CHRIS WENT ON TO SAY THAT THE FCC FINED SONIC CABLE OF CALIFORNIA \$6,000 FOR CAUSING INTERFERENCE TO AN AMATEUR STATION. THE FCC WILL LIKELY HAVE TO MAKE A RULE TO THE EFFECT THAT LOW POWER TV STATIONS HAVE A 10 YEAR LICENSE. ON VOLUNTEER EXAMINATIONS, THE FCC WILL RULE LATER WHETHER THE EXAMS WILL CHANGE, BUT IT IS NOT LIKELY. ON THE WOODPECKER, MANY REPORTS HAVE BEEN GIVEN TO THE USSR TO NO EFFECT. REGARDING THE 20 METER BAND, THE LAST CHRIS HEARD WAS THAT NEW RULES WILL COME OUT RIGHT AFTER THE FIRST OF THE YEAR. ABOUT THE INTEGRITY OF THE VOLUNTEER EXAMS: THERE WILL BE A LARGE BANK OF QUESTIONS AND IT WILL USE THREE EXAMINERS FOR EACH APPLICANT. THIS SHOULD HELP ESPECIALLY IN PLACES LIKE SAIPAN AND OVERSEAS EMBASSYS.

SMITTY, W6JZU, WAS CONGRATULATED ON HIS NEW EXTRA LICENSE.

NEW MEMBERSHIP APPLICANTS SHOULD TRY TO GET CARDS CHECKED BEFORE THE FIRST READING SINCE IT IS DISRUPTIVE TO DO IT AT THE MEETING.

STEVE, N6ST, ASKED THAT MEMBERS WHO ARE DUAL MEMBERS OF NCDXC AND NCCC SUPPORT THE NCCC IN THE UPCOMING CQWW DX CONTESTS.

FIRST READINGS WERE GIVEN FOR: RON OTT, W6XY; JEFF KEY, N6EFB (CW MAN?); TAYLOR WASHBURN, N6DYS.

SECOND READINGS WERE GIVEN FOR CHUCK, AA6G; BILL, W6TEX; AND TED, KA6W. WE ALL HOPE THEY ENJOY MEMBERSHIP IN THE CLUB AND WE WARMLY WELCOME THEM!

ERIC, W6DU, THANKED LOU, K6TMB, AND HIS CREW FOR A VERY FINE JOB WITH THE CLUB PICNIC.

THE NEXT CLUB MEETING WILL BE IN HAYWARD AT MIGUEL'S. THE DECEMBER 10 CHRISTMAS PARTY WILL BE IN SAN FRANCISCO AT SUN HUNG HEUNG IN CHINATOWN AND WILL FEATURE THE VISIT OF SANTA CLAUS, W6SC.

William Vette, Lockheed engineer and authority on shortwave radio

A memorial service will be held Saturday for William John Vette, 68, a retired engineer with Lockheed Missiles & Space Co. in Sunnyvale and a nationally noted authority on shortwave radio.

Mr. Vette died Tuesday at Kaiser hospital in Santa Clara after a long illness.

Mr. Vette was born in Lafayette, Colo. Members of his family were early settlers in eastern Colorado.

He was an electronics technician in Denver and in Chicago, then enlisted in the Navy during World War II. Mr. Vette taught electronics in Navy radar schools during the war.

Mr. Vette was a student and also taught electronics courses at Del Mar College in Corpus Christi, Texas.

He owned and operated a radio-

repair store in Corpus Christi, then worked as an engineer for Stavid Engineering Co. in Key West, Fla. Mr. Vette was transferred to San Diego and in 1961 to Sunnyvale after Stavid Engineering was bought by Lockheed.

"He installed all the equipment in the 'blue cube' building (near Moffett Field Naval Air Station)," said Mr. Vette's wife, Lucille. "It controls the satellites."

Mr. Vette retired in about 1979.

He was former president of the Santa Clara County Amateur Radio Association and the Key West Radio Club. He was a member of the Northern California D X Club, a ham radio club that specializes in communicating with ham operators in other countries.

Mr. Vette wrote several articles on shortwave radio, which were

published in magazines throughout the country.

"He liked working (communicating with ham operators in) all the countries that he could," Mr. Vette's wife said. "He had worked over 300 countries. He liked building equipment. He was fascinated by it from the time he was a young man. He was quite a talker. He enjoyed talking to the people around the world."

Mr. Vette was a member of the Quarter Century Wireless Association and SIRS of San Jose.

Mr. Vette and his wife celebrated their 43rd wedding anniversary in September.

Besides his wife, Mr. Vette is survived by a daughter, Barbara Senter of Los Angeles; two sons, William J. Vette Jr. of Colorado and Charles Vette of Virginia;
