Ferne was known around the world as the behind-the-scenes QSL manager for over 60 DX stations and a stamp collector of major importance. Because of her interest in rare stamps, many DXers went out of their way to emblazon their envelopes with many rare stamps. It was no secret that Ferne was the real manager although Rubin was listed in all the references. It was Ferne who dug out all the erroneous times and dates to make sure that the much needed QSL card was sent. She was credited with having handled all the QSLs for HKØBKX, well over 20,000 total! She was a great supporter of DXing and a friend to all, particularly Rubin! Several years ago, at the height of one of our major storms with winds at 60 MPH and rain coming down by the bucket, she watched Rubin trying to lower his tower. Standing in the rain with only his slippers and bathrobe and without decent light, Rubin was doing his best to get the tower down and not catch pneumonia at the same time. Nothing was said right away, but a couple of weeks later mysterious package arrived. Opening it, Rubin found his new motor drive for his tower, thanks to Ferne and her concern for him. We will all miss her and wish Rubin well in his own recovery from the repair of an aortic aneurysm.

**GENERAL MEETING
NCDXC, FEBRUARY, 1995**

The meeting, held at the Dunfey Hotel in San Mateo on February 11, was called to order at 20:05 by President Knochenhauer. "Knoch" reminded the group that nominations for DXer of the year are being solicited by Jerry, W8MEP. Please submit your letters of nomination to him prior to 1 March.

An excellent presentation was given on the recent DXpedition to Syria. Further information is available elsewhere in this DXer. Three requests for reinstatement were approved. They are KN6SO, Marc Willis of Valley springs, KX6C, Harry Makler of Palo Alto and K16YB, Charlie Southall of Pebble Beach. Welcome back.

KK6EK announced a proposed operation to Easter Island this coming September. Brad Wyatt reported on ARRL activities. Membership applications of Charles Wirth, WA6MME: Steve Merchant, N4TQO and Norman Buell, W6SJH. Were given their second readings. They were all approved unanimously and will be welcomed aboard at the next meeting.

First readings were given of applications of Kevin Mc Evoy, KØMX, of San Francisco and Bob Zavrel, W7SX, of Scotts Valley.

The proposal made by AA6KX dealing with changing the ground-rules for a north-south competition for the DX contests was discussed at some length. Some alternates were also suggested. It was decided that the matter be tabled pending the solicitation of more information from the many members who can not regularly attend meetings. Meeting adjourned at 2245.

The program for the evening, an account of the recent DXpedition to Syria, in which many of our club members participated was A stellar event and was warmly received. Team members were; W6OAT, NW6P, K6ANP, N6TV, W6OTC, WA2TMP and K3NA. Many of the participants cooperated in giving a part of the presentation and the fact that they did so dressed in their recently acquired mid-east costumes added greatly to their presentation. The show was organized by K6ANP. It was only when one heard the voices that one could recognize that they were really all local club members. Perhaps the costumes were not only for local color. They could also have been disguises.

YK1AO, a retired Brigadier in the Syrian army was put in contact with W6OAT who recognized the need for this country, especially on cw and on the lower bands. YK1AO has been one of the very few hams in Syria who had been on the air, but who was now QRT because of equipment breakdown. Apparently local repair facilities for ham equipment are not available. shipping of equipment to manufacturers is not feasible for cost reasons, including further customs duty upon return. Over a long period of time arrangements were made between Rusty and YK1AO, Omar, which culminated in this operation. This was a first operation from YK by others than Syrians.

Equipment and other assistance was received from Yaesu, ETO, Force 12 AND NCDXF.

The operating site was in the building of the local telecom in Damascus. The large flat roof was helpful for antenna erection but the site was not great for stateside contacts.

Some 14,500 contacts were made with many of them on the lower frequencies and the great majority to Europe. High frequency band conditions were poor and equipment breakdowns limited the number of contacts. Certainly running with low power was not conducive to a big score. The score for CQWW CW was 12 megapoints.

People were friendly and hospitable. living conditions were comfortable and food was good. No hardships were encountered in those areas.

In order to be sure that our DXpeditioners were operating under the rules set up, monitoring was being done in the room adjacent to the operating position. After listening to the contest for a while one of the monitoring personnel came in and asked why they just kept sending 5nn. It was explained that they were operating a contest. This seemed incomprehensible to him. Why would a bunch of people spend so much time and money to go to Syria just to send 5nn?

As YKOA was using a network of computers to handle logging, they suggested that the monitor bring in a computer and hook it up to the network. He now had all the information they did and in hard copy. That solved the problem nicely. It was said that then whenever they got a new multiplier they could hear cheering from the Syrians in the other room.

Among other unexpected problems, the group was informed that they must turn in the equipment they were taking home, to customs at the airport at least 48 hours prior to departure and that it should also weigh the same as it did upon arrival.

Losing two full days of the operation cut naturally was disappointing to say the least. The first situation was handled by taking a trip by taxi, to the very old city of Palmyra some 200 km away from Damascus. In ancient times it had been a trading city on the road to the Tigris and Euphrates region and had been razed by the Romans in around 200 AD. Some excellent slides of the area were shown.

The second situation was obviated by the simple expedient of purchasing some hammers to make up the 40 kilos. I expect you might make a good deal for a hammer with Tom, NW6P.

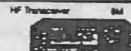

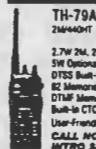

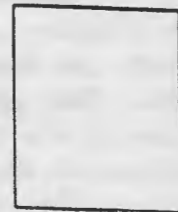
