
ARRL DX Contest



Restoring Vintage Ham Gear



Ted Algren, KA6W Chairman of this year's DXer of the Year Committee advises us that the committee is open to receive nominations.

As you know, the Committee consists of the Chairman (KA6W) and two other members who are appointed by the Board of Directors. The other appointed members are; Rusty Epps, W6OAT and Keith Butts, KN6K. These three appointed members then select two silent members whose identities remain undisclosed.

The criteria for selection of the DXer of the Year are spelled out in the NCDXC Procedures Manual. The Manual also states that when nobody meets the criteria, a DXer of the year selection may not necessarily be made for the year. So, please consider your nominations carefully. Once you've decided, send your nominations to any of the three named members at their Email or postal (snail mail) addresses listed in the roster. Nominations close on March 10, 2001.

The DXer of the Year selection will be announced at the Saturday banquet at the International DX Convention in Visalia.

DXCC Announces New 17 Meter Award

The following was sent to us by Jack Troster, W6ISQ. It just missed making it into the January DXer. Jack has added a few words of wisdom to help us all "get it right" -Ed

DXCC is pleased to announce the addition of a 17 Meter Single Band DXCC award. Applications for this award will be accepted beginning January 2, 2001. 17 Meter DXCC certificates will be dated but not numbered. 17 meter credits will also count toward the DeSoto Cup competition for the year 2001.

If you do not know what credits you have on 17 meters, you may contact DXCC for an update prior to applying. This will help avoid duplicates and additional costs. If you have web access and can handle ADOBE (.pdf) files, contact DXCC at dxcc@arrl.org for a copy of your record. If you do not have web access, please send a note to DXCC along with \$1.50 for postage or an SASE with \$1.50 in postage. For further information, please contact DXCC at dxcc@arrl.org.

Here is a bit more info on the 17M DXCC thing. (*This is a message from W6ISQ to Bill Moore, NC1L.* -Ed.) Bill:

Just read the statement about 17 M now being open for new DXCC listing. I want to forward the statement to our local DX Club newsletter, but want to clear up a small matter. I have about 120 or so 17M cards, which have been approved by DXCC desk and I have received a little sticker for reaching the 100 mark. It is now stuck on the 5BDXCC plaque. I now have about 100 more 17M cards. Now I can just submit those 100 cards for further credit. Is that correct? So I will wind up with — say—220 on 17M.

Also, henceforth, there will be a 17M column printed on the summary sheets you return with our approved all-band DXCC credits. i.e. alongside the 160-80-40-etc listings. If people are using the new electronic card checking method of card submission, they will go ahead with that method when submitting for credit.

Thanks for anything you can send along to be sure the boys submit for 17M properly. P.S. I still like the mailing of cards in to you—hi. Have a fine New Year and tnx

Hi Jack:

Yes, if one has 100 on file then they can apply for the award. As long as no cards are sent in they only need to send the \$10 certificate fee. If cards are sent then is it \$10 for the certificate and \$10 for the submission fee (first submission) plus postage. Copies of records will now consist of the 17 meter band also.

DXer Profile: W6ZX, Alex Meyer

DXer Profile this month features Alex Meyer, W6ZX. He is easy to find in the Club Roster. His is the last call on the last page. But that's about the only time you will find Alex last at anything. There is no telling just where on the bands or on what mode you may catch Alex. Here is a quick rundown of his operating: he has 341 confirmed in mixed mode (guess what country he still needs to have them all). He has 336 worked and 333 confirmed on SSB; 324 worked and 322 confirmed on CW; (Hold on! We're not done yet!) 328 confirmed on RTTY and 258 worked on mobile with 243 confirmed.

Now you would think with all of this, Alex would be burned out. Hey, by the time you get this DXer, Alex will be starting up on 6 Meters with his new KENWOOD rig. Thank goodness that he is retired and can find some free time.

He joined the club in May of 1996 and some may recall that his original call was WB6AFJ. But he has also held the call signs of PA9AQF and ON/WB6AFJ. He has operated from DL, F, G, GJ, GM, GW, HB, HB0, KH6, KH7, LX, ON, OZ, PA, SM, VE, VK, VS6, W, XE, YB, ZL and 9V. That is more DX than some Hams have ever worked. All this and he has only been licensed since 1962.

His main HF rig is a YAESU FT-1000 with a KENWOOD TS-930S as his backup. He has so many VHF & UHF rigs running so many modes that they can't all be listed. But rest assured! He uses them all. The HF tower is self-supporting and at the top is a TH-7, again topped by WARC sets. He has excellent wire antennas for 40 and 80. The tuner is a B&W US1500A and his crown jewel is an ALPHA 87A. The station is not just impressive, but also functional as is evidenced by his many achievements.

GUD LUCK on 6 Meters Alex——I am glad that I don't operate there and have to go up against you! It was a fun visit.


